


The Canal de Pierre Dimanche by mountain bike

Molines-en-Queyras



Vallée de l'Aigue Blanche (Benjamin Musella - PNR Queyras)



An air tour with clear views for the slower parts and a wooded single track for the steepest parts.

This tour overlooks the valley of l'Aigue Blanche and the Guil and offers aerial views. The descent is of progressive difficulty and quite smooth.

Trek

Departure : Molines-en-Queyras

Arrival : Molines-en-Queyras

Markings : ⚡ VTT

Cross the Chanterane bridge, reach the main road and turn left.

1 - Take the last road to the right before exiting the village. Follow this path until a hairpin turn on the left that marks the end of the road.


2 – At the hairpin turn, go straight: you have arrived at the Canal de Pierre Dimanche. Follow the canal, you will come across a track and a river. After the river, take the first trail going down on the left and which leads to the hamlet of Pras Haut.

3 – Reach a road at the level of the hamlet (to the right, a possible connection with the circuit “40 lacets”), take a left and immediately the next trail on the right in direction of the Rua, on a smooth single track. After the river, climb the slight rise to reach the Serre des Chabrans.

4 – Pass through the hamlet and descend until the end of the road. Reach Molines-en-Queyras located on the left, take the rise on the left in direction of Italy.

5 - Continue on D 205 until Pierre Grosse, through the hamlet and reach to the Chanterane bridge on the right.



⌚ Sorbus aucuparia (B)

This small tree was once planted to attract thrushes. Its name comes from the fact that birds disseminate its seeds. In the spring, it produces umbels of white flowers that become red berries in July. Its fruit is edible when it is overripe but very acid. The berries can be used to make compotes or jellies. Be careful though: the seeds are toxic. Its small size, rapid growth and elegance mean it is now used as an ornamental tree.

⌚ Calendula officinalis (C)

Better known under the name of Marigold, this plant is used in herbal medicine or cultivated in gardens to scare away insects. Its seeds can withstand very low temperatures (-25 °C / -13 °F) and are spread by the wind. These characteristics explain its presence here because it is not its natural distribution area. The Marigold has calming and healing properties. It is used for skin problems, various inflammations, gastric problems and liver diseases.
